From The Rector

Blessings to you as we begin a new year together at St. Helena's Episcopal Church & School! In this issue, you will read articles reflecting on how our Risen Lord was at work among us, and through us in the year past. You will also read some of the ministry plans and initiatives for the spring of 2023 as we follow Christ and serve in his Kingdom. I hope you will be present and join in conversation at the Annual Parish Meeting of St. Helena's on Sunday, January 22. On that morning we will worship at 7:45am & 10am. We will enjoy breakfast together as we view a presentation of St. Helena's Master Plan, elect 4 new



vestry members, and hear ministry plans for the spring. I hope to see you there.

- When 2022 began, our church, school, and nation were still dealing with the threats of the Omicron variant of COVID. As we moved from winter into spring, it became clear that our Parish Family was rapidly rebounding from the pandemic: worship attendance grew significantly as people began to feel more comfortable at in-person worship. Increasing numbers of visitors blessed us with their presence. In March, we were able to gather for Lenten Dinners and full Holy Week worship services. We re-launched ministries put on hold by COVID, including Men of St. Helena's and Lay Eucharistic Visitors. By the summer, we were able to host the largest Vacation Bible School in our history, and return to Wounded Knee, South Dakota. In September, over 300 members of our Family worshipped, played, and kicked-off the fall at Camp Capers. Our school was able to resume field trips, and Sunday worship attendance- both in person and online- grew significantly. We launched new ministries including Greeters and Empty Nesters. As we move into 2023, COVID is not gone, but we seem to have learned to live with its presence even as we take some personal precautions, and we continue to be renewed by the opportunity to gather together in-person for worship, fellowship, study, and fun.
- 2022 was a season of staff transitions at St. Helena's. Whit Matteson and Sheryl Loveless retired from their ministry here, and we welcomed Lynn Lowry, Amy Ryland and Devvie Asel to our staff. Stefanie Nitschke moved from part-time to full-time to serve our growing number of young families. In September we welcomed our curate, The Rev. Jamie George, and in November we sent out The Rev. Brian Fox to be Rector of St. Paul's Church & School in San Antonio. There will be more staff transitions in the year ahead. I am looking for a priest to fill the position vacated by Brian Fox, and we will be looking for a person to lead Middle School youth among other duties.

From The Rector

There are many signs of health and vibrancy in our congregation.

- We are a 7-day a -week church. Our facilities are used weekly by a great variety of ministries inside and outside our parish: Sr. Fellowship art classes, 12-step recovery groups, Hill Country Youth Orchestra, St. Helena's School, Bible studies, youth and children ministries, and much more.
- Fifty people were confirmed, received, or reaffirmed by Bishop Reed in 2022, and sixteen were baptized.
- Our average Sunday attendance for 2022 was 301 in person and 75 online.
- **Financial giving for 2023 is up almost 20% over 2022,** a sign of the incredible generosity and faithfulness of our parish family.
- And, we continue to partner in our community, through our diocese, and in South **Dakota** to serve the needs of our brothers and sisters in Christ.
- The outreach budget for 2023 has been doubled, and we are exploring the commencement of a monthly Sunday worship service at Morningside Menger Springs in the weeks ahead.

As we rebounded from COVID it became abundantly clear that many of our ministries are outgrowing our physical spaces.

- The **11:00am worship service is full** every week and the Youth Group has **outgrown the Youth House** on a weekly basis.
- The Sr. Fellowship Art classes have moved into the Parish Hall for more space.
- We need **more parking and better accessibility** for people with physical challenges.

With input from the congregation, and the parish and school staff, **a Master Plan has been adopted by the Vestry** to identify needs and opportunities, and to create a phased approach for the development of our campus in the decades ahead. I look forward to hearing your thoughts about this plan.

Thank you for your faithfulness to our Lord and for your presence at St. Helena's. Thank you for persevering through the pandemic together. Thank you for loving and serving the Lord. May we run with patience together the race set before us in 2023.

Cross-Finder is Now Digital!

Each year St. Helena's publishes 5-6 copies of our newsletter, Cross-Finder. **Each copy is 22-28 pages and is mailed to our 650+ families.** In the interest of being good stewards of the environment and of our resources, we are piloting delivering Cross-Finder through our website (directions shown at bottom of this page) and using Constant Contact email.





Celebrating our Campus Master Plan

In 2005, the leadership of St. Helena's planned for the future needs and opportunities of living into our mission to welcome all God's Children to grow with us in grace and proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ. They developed a Master Plan for the campus and the phases in which to implement those plans. Those phases included construction of Wendler Hall and the purchase of two properties on Rock Street: the Hill House and the Children's Ministry Center. In 2018, St. Helena's retired all debt on those projects.



- This year, the Vestry and the dedicated members of the Master Planning Taskforce undertook the task of updating our Master Plan. Since the 2005 plan, St. Helena's has acquired adjoining properties, started a school, and added many new ministries, staff, and programs. There are now 13 buildings on our campus – only 3 of which were built for church purposes. Our church and our community continue to grow and St. Helena's needs a reasonable plan for continuing our mission in the heart of Boerne in the next decade.
- With input from the staff, congregation, and school, the Master Planning Task Force has created a campus plan that includes preserving the historic sanctuary, construction of new facilities, and remodeling of some existing facilities to meet the needs and priorities of our mission.
- A Master Plan is not about designing buildings, or getting into the details of carpet colors, paint colors, light fixtures, etc. It is a plan for where to locate buildings, parking, programs, playgrounds, accessibility needs, and more, with a logical progression of phased development. Stay tuned for more opportunities to hear about St. Helena's Master Plan.

- As these lyrics that Carol Gish sang, lingered in the air at our final performance of A Walk in Bethlehem 2022, I watched the crowd. The parking lot and Rock street were filled with babies in strollers, young children whose hands were filled with apples and bread, sticky with honey and adults of all ages smiled, shook hands and fell into conversations with family and friends. I watch the cast, who had stayed in character so well, relax, smile and laugh.
- Each year I tell Mary and Joseph to stay on the stage just a little longer because people often take photos or gather their children and talk about the baby. This year after the final performance, one little girl, about 3 years old, REALLY wanted to see the baby's face. Her mom asked if the family could come up on the stage. I knew if I allowed one family on the stage others would ask, so I offered to walk the little girl up on the stage. She was eager. She looked at the baby, and said, "He's beautiful."
- And so we ended another year of our Walk in Bethlehem with my thoughts on her eagerness to approach the Christ child and the simple words, "He's beautiful."
- Our Walk in Bethlehem again shown through as a success. One night Father David chatted with the visitors as they lined up awaiting entry through the gates. He discovered that about half of the people had never been through our experience before, while the other half had been before. Some had visited for years.
- **Thanks to the entire church family for all that you gave to our community.** When I say there are too many to name, that is a truth. So thank you to the people who invited others. Thank you to those who reposted the invitation on their social media accounts. Thank you to the construction crew, the prop committee, the costume committee, the middle school youth group for advertising it on their float in the Weihnachts parade, the cast, my personal performance crew, the deconstruct crew, the church staff and my husband.
- Until we walk again in our little town of Bethlehem, let us be eager to seek the Christ and recognize his beauty!

- The Christian life is a journey of life-long learning. St. Helena's Episcopal Church strives to form mature disciples of Jesus Christ. As such, we believe every person should be actively engaged in expanding their knowledge and understanding of the Christian Faith as we follow Jesus together. As part of our commitment to this process, on **January 29 we resume Sunday School for adults, children and youth**.
- The Extraordinary Ordinary of the Episcopal Church is the topic for adult discussion Jan 29-Feb 19. Two elephants are trouncing around St. Helena's and we might want to talk about them. Now, they aren't actual elephants. However, first we have an ordained woman roaming around the halls. We've never seen one of those at St. Helena's before.  - In what ways are we all called to guard the faith and unity of the Church?

Discernment of a Bishop for West Texas

In May of 2022, The Rt. Rev. David M. Reed, Bishop of West Texas, announced his intention to retire in 2023 and called for the election of his successor. The Diocesan Standing Committee formed a Bishop Nominating Committee and went to work creating a nomination and discernment process that will result in the election of a new Bishop for West Texas. Clergy and lay leaders from all over the country were invited to submit names of potential nominees. Through prayer, a series of interviews, a discernment retreat, and completion of thorough background screenings, the Bishop Nominating Committee named three nominees for Bishop of West Texas:

+The Rev. Ripp Hardaway, Rector of St. John's, New Braunfels.

+The Rev. Alex Montes-Vela, Missioner for Congregational Vitality & New Initiatives for the Diocese of Texas.

+The Rev. Dr. David G. Read, Rector of St. Helena's Church & School, Boerne.

- During the weekend of January 27-29, a series of Discernment Forums will be held throughout the Diocese for people to meet the Nominees and hear directly from them. The closest forum to St. Helena's will be at St. Thomas' Episcopal Church in San Antonio on Sunday, January 29 at 4:00pm. You are invited to attend. St. Thomas' is located at the intersection of Loop 1604 & Hwy 281 N. (1416 N. Loop 1604 E.)
- On Saturday, February 18, the Annual Council of the Diocese of West Texas will elect one of the three Nominees to be Bishop-Elect. Clergy and Lay Delegates from each congregation in the Diocese will cast ballots until a nominee receives a simple majority of the Clergy Delegates and the Lay Delegates on the same ballot. The Bishop-Elect must then receive consent from a majority of the Bishops and Standing Committees in The Episcopal Church. The Bishop-Elect will be consecrated Bishop on July 8, 2023. You are also invited to pray for the diocese, the nominees, and their families throughout this process.
