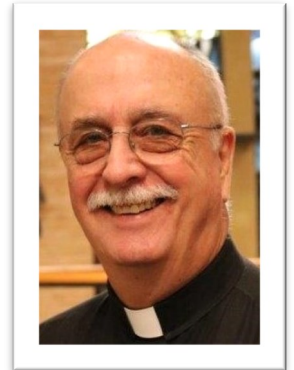

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A Note From Our Interim Rector

I want to thank you all for the joyous and beautiful welcome you extended to me on my first Sunday at St. Helena's. I can honestly admit that this is one of the most friendly and welcoming communities I have ever met. Your love for one another and your joyful welcome of the newcomer is so very evident.



For a little background on me, after twenty years in full time ministry I retired at the end of 2016. Within a few short months Bishop Reed called me into his office and said he wanted to start a school to educate men and women to be ordained as Bi-Vocational priests. These new priests would serve small congregations that could not afford a full-time clergy person. He asked if I would consider being the dean of this new school and get it started. I knew nothing about starting a school, but it is hard to say no to your Bishop! The Iona School for Ministry has graduated nine students who are now ordained priests serving throughout the diocese.

About this same time Bishop Reed also asked me to be the Interim Rector of St. Alban's Episcopal Church in Harlingen, TX. That would be the first of five churches I would serve as Interim Rector over the next seven years, including St. Helena's. Being the Dean of the Iona School for Ministry and being an Interim Rector are what I love doing. One is preparing men and women for the ordained ministry and the other is shepherding congregations through the transition from one leader to the next.

St. Helena's is a very special place for me, and Fr. David has been my trusted friend for many years. The same church, St. Francis, San Antonio, formed us as young men and that same church sent us both off to seminary. Since I went to seminary after a career in business, David was a seasoned priest by the time I graduated from seminary. I saw David not only as a friend, but as a trusted mentor, and would visit with him often about the many things I needed to know about ministry. Much of the experiences and examples he shared with me came from St. Helena's.

Joyously continue growing forward

Through the eyes of Fr. David, I have watched this church grow and prosper. I have seen how you have welcomed the newcomer and loved one another. I have rejoiced at the mission work you do both here and afar. I know the future holds even more great things for you as long as you put your trust in our Lord Jesus Christ. In this community, St. Helena's is his witness of what a Christian fellowship should be. Joyously continue growing forward and know that God is leading you into a bright new future with the next leader he will bring your way.

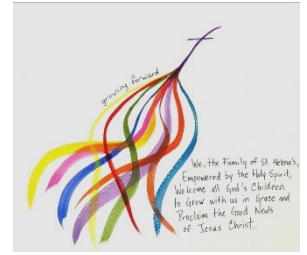

Growing Forward

These are truly exciting, dynamic, and growing times at St. Helena's.

Each and every day we are growing and deepening our faith and ministries. Each sunrise offers us the opportunity to branch out and spread the good news of Jesus Christ. As you know over the last few months, I have been asking that we “**Grow Forward**” during this time of transition and as a parish family we have been doing that very thing.

One way we grow is by deepening our roots, much in the way that a tree drives its roots deeper and deeper into the ground to make the tree stronger, able to withstand the winds that test it, able to spread its branches further and further. As the tree's tap root grows deeper into new soil, into new potential, the whole tree prospers. In many ways our Parish is like that tree and its deepening roots, its tap root. Let's think of **TAP**, as an acronym to guide us, a simple triad of letters **T-A-P**, which can serve us as a daily reminder to guide our collective and individual spiritual growth.

Let's explore the TAP acronym beginning with T or “t”, where “t” symbolizes The one True Cross, where we should turn our focus every day.

The one True Cross serves as an ever-present reminder of Christ's sacrifice for us and of God's eternal and unconditional love. *“For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life” (John 3:16).* May each of us set aside **T**ime every day to be in conversation with God, lay our **T**roubles at the foot of **T**he Cross, be gracious and give **T**hanks for the many blessings in our lives.

Next in our acronym is A. As Christians we are called to Act, in fact to take Apostolic Action.

Our parish family has been and remains in **A**ction. Our campus is **A**live with **A**ctivity, our summer is filled with mission work, Vacation Bible School, **A**ctivities for youth and adults.

Vestry has also engaged Ben Adam as our **A**rchitect to prepare the detailed design work to connect Wendler Hall and the Historic Sanctuary, so we may realize the many **A**ccessibility benefits this project will provide.

We have an important step that will precede the construction of the connector, the remodel/ renovation of the Parish Hall. The Vestry has taken the **A**ction to secure a guaranteed contract for this work and hopes to **A**ccomplish the work this year while our school is on summer break. The Vestry has set aside a little over 2/3 of the funds for the remodel project and are extending an invitation to the congregation to raise the remaining balance. We need to raise at least \$100,000 to cover the cost of the Parish Hall remodel, any additional funds raised will be set aside for the larger connector project.

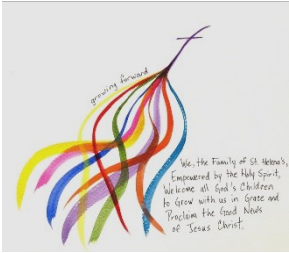
Finally, we come to P. We are also very active Planning for our future.

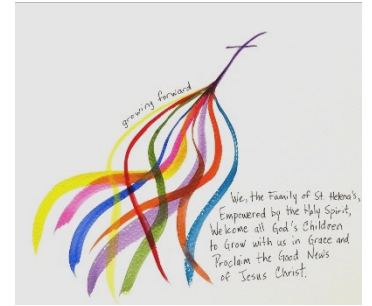

Palm Sunday Was Amazing!

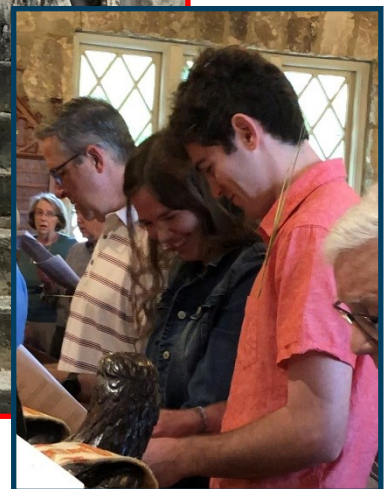

If you know how to play them join us just for fun. Each student will design and create their own game by Thursday and teach others how to play it. Who know Pokémon might make an appearance too.


July 10 -13 Archeology - Let's Dig It! 9:00am - 2:00pm

Emergency request for volunteers and supplies from the Plaza de Paz Respite Center and the Diocese of West Texas.

For the past year, Plaza de Paz has partnered with the Migrant Resource Center (MRC)/Centro de Bienvenida shelter in San Antonio, sending individuals or families who need overnight accommodations to their shelter from Plaza de Paz. After consulting with the Rt. Rev. David M. Reed, Plaza de Paz Respite Center will temporarily expand its current services to provide short-term, overnight housing for migrants, who have been processed and released by U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP).
