
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From The Rector

If you were on campus during the week this summer you no doubt heard the joyful voices of children at Vacation Bible School, Arts Academy, Camp Wacky, or attending our school summer activities. Bryce Boddie and Ben Houck stewarded the installation of the new and upgraded system to serve the 9:00 Contemporary worship service, Sunday School, large gatherings, receptions, and much more.


Vestry Approval of Digital Delivery of Cross-Finder

Susan (St. Helena's Organist) and I live in Hunt. We moved to Hunt about 10 years ago, from Atlanta. Like so many others in this area, I grew up in Houston, and came to the Hill Country for family vacations and summer cap all through my childhood. We live across the street from my Mom, and various family members have had property right around here for nearly 100 years. We have three sons and two grandsons, all still in Atlanta.

We started at St. Helena's in November of 2015; Sue took a year off to play for the Methodist Church in Kerrville, and I left in spring of 2022 to work full time at Kerr◆Konnect, a non-profit transportation provider in Kerrville. Kerr◆Konnect provides low-cost rides using volunteer drivers, in a 10-mile radius around the Kerr County Courthouse. We deliver around 400 trips each month to people who can't drive themselves for one reason or another. We have about 65 volunteer drivers and about 10 volunteer office staff. I'm really excited about coming back to St. Helena's as the interim chancel choir director!

Meet Our New Children's Choir Director: Destiny Lucero

Destiny Lucero is our new choir director for St. Helena's Singers. She loves children and assisted Lynn with St. Helena's Singers last year. Destiny grew up in Fredericksburg Tx and served seven honorable years as a Naval aircrewman on the now-retired P-3 Orion. She is now enrolled in the University of Incarnate Word Music Therapy program. Destiny plans to graduate in two years and work with youth patients in hospitals, schools, and organizations that work with autism.










On June 23 the bus left for the Pine Ridge Reservation in South Dakota and Messiah Church.

Youth Mission Trip Personal Reflections 1

Mission trip from the perspective of a first timer

The Lakota Sioux Tribe in South Dakota was definitely much different than what I expected. There was something that felt very surreal about being in the midst of such a unique culture, and in the middle of all these things going on that you just don't hear about on the news. People selling handcrafted jewelry, dream catchers, and other things for a living. Kids who probably haven't had a good, healthy meal in months, or years...if ever. And in the center of all of this, a church.



Messiah Church was a place where we created friendships, joked around, listened to stories, painted and patched up the ceiling and walls, reupholstered pews, and so much more. It was such a fun week, all while having this twinge of feeling a bit out of place. It's hard to see people struggling with poverty and having addictions. It's not what we're used to, in our "perfect" world.

One day, we were packing up to leave Messiah for the day, and a lot of us ended up grouping around Father Eagle Bull's wife, Charlette (shown in the picture to the right) She was telling stories about when she was a girl, and we all got a glimpse of what it is like to be a child in the Lakota Tribe.

It was such a different experience. I would have never guessed what it was like to be on this trip. The trip there and back, stopping at all the different churches, and being on the Reservation itself. You bet I'm tagging along next year too!

Youth Mission Trip Personal Reflections 2

As this was my first time on mission trip, I didn't really have any idea of what to expect. I really just went with the flow and even though Mrs. Dawn had a plan of what we would be doing while we were there, everyone there had to adapt as the days went on and as new needs were made aware of. For example, I was supposed to be doing flooring for at least half of the time we were there; however, we managed to finish pretty quickly (once we had all of the needed materials) which meant I had to find a project to jump into elsewhere. Sure enough, a new need arose. As



it turns out the water on the reservation comes straight out of the ground with little to no filtering which means they get a lot of unwanted dirt and sediment in their water. This causes lots of issues with their plumbing. Because of this issue, I spent the remainder of my time disassembling toilets and a sink, cleaning out all of the dirt and sediment buildup as well as replacing all of the parts that had deteriorated over time. I got a sense of how something as seemingly small as using the restroom can become a challenge due to their location and infrastructure.

Once you get out on the reservation, you start to get a sense of just how difficult it is to just get supplies and materials because of the locations of the nearest stores, let alone funding it. Before arriving, Mrs. Dawn was informing us about the dire economic situation that

most of the people on the reservation are in. She also informed us about the generosity and sense of community that they have on the reservation. This truly became apparent when on the last night we were there, Father Eagle Bull and Charlette made us all Indian tacos; however, it wasn't just for us. I noticed as we were leaving, there was a line of people from the reservation waiting outside for food as well. They weren't just giving back to us or letting us in on their culture, they were giving to the whole community. It was truly awe-inspiring to see these people who don't have a whole lot, but what they do have they share with those around them.

Youth Mission Trip Personal Reflections 3

Even though I'd interacted with the Eagle Bulls briefly in the three previous years, I didn't feel like I knew the people who keep Messiah going, so I asked both Dawn and Fr Eagle Bull to have time to share stories. I was able to spend most of the week with the Eagle Bulls and it was even better than I'd imagined.

Char is fearless. She was generous with her stories, and many of them were filled with, "I didn't care!" because she will stand up for what she knows is right even when it is unpopular. She also has the ability to make her environment beautiful with her laughter and decorations. In her stories were many uncomfortable truths we need to hear to even begin to understand her strength.

Fr. Eagle Bull is a generally quiet man, so when he speaks, one should listen. It's another story when he is able to communicate in Lakota. One doesn't have to understand the language to hear how much he cares about the future generations. His gift of faith and natural ability to seamlessly connect traditional Lakota beliefs to Christianity proves all people are more alike than they are different.

The importance of community is evident in Lakota greetings and farewells. When our group departed, Fr. Eagle Bull taught us toksa (doh-k-shah) a shortened version of the phrase for "I'll see you or meet you again." Through a continued partnership, we will see how "He makes the whole body fit together perfectly. As each part does its own special work, it helps the other parts grow, so that the whole body is healthy and growing and full of love" (Ephesians 4:16).




