From our Senior Warden

- The approaching season of Lent marks the part of the year where we go through the waning days of winter, move closer to the renewing days of Spring, where the days get longer, and the world around us shows the signs of new and emerging growth. Our spiritual journey in many ways can parallel this, as we spend time in our Lenten practices.
- The 40 days of Lent begin in mid-February. Traditionally, it marks a season of fasting and abstinence, praying, Bible reading, corporate worship, and works of mercy. Terms whose meanings we may not all be familiar with. The Episcopal Church (<u>www.episcopalnet.org</u>) offers some wonderful resources. I've highlighted a few of my favorite practices below:
 - **Fasting & abstinence** Keep it smaller (portions) and simpler (healthier non-processed foods).
 - Praying Follow the daily devotionals found in the Book of Common Prayer (BCP) on pages 137-140. These offer a simple and peaceful morning prayer, evening prayer, or a family prayer. Or, read through the Prayers and Thanksgivings on pages 810 841 of the BCP. (If you don't own a prayer book, you can access the BCP online free at: <u>https://www.bcponline.org/.)</u>
 - **Reading Scripture** Spend time in the Word. Download an app such as *The Bible App* by Bible.com which can be set to send you daily Bible verses. Or simply pick up your Bible and read.
 - Attending corporate worship Attend Sunday Services. Consider attending a 10 am Wednesday service. Come to Mother Jamie's "Thresholds" Sunday School class at 10:10 am. Worshipping together strengthens our faith, shines hope into our days, and empowers us to love others more freely.
 - **Doing works of mercy** After spending time in prayer forgive an old grudge, give to the less fortunate, call on someone who is ill. These acts are an outward expression of your faith through your acts of kindness no matter how small they may seem.
- Simply living into these practices for 40 days; these small steps of thanksgiving, discipline, and change, and you may see and experience new and deep growth you grow forward into the blessings of 2024.

From Mother Jamie

I wonder what the world thinks of Lent these days. And, does the world think of Lent these days? Ashes on the forehead, denying thyself of sweets and sodas, eating fish on Fridays. Why do the crazy Christians walk around with black crosses smudged all over their faces?

- So let's talk about Lent. If you were not raised in the Episcopal Church, you may have questions.
- Lent is the 40 day season on the liturgical calendar between the Season after Epiphany and Easter. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent is a season of self-examination and repentance. The 40 days of Lent mirror the 40 days Moses spent on the mountain with the Lord (Ex 24:18), the 40 years Israel spent in the desert (Deut 8:2), and the 40 days Jesus spent in the wilderness preparing for public ministry (Mk 1:12-13). Lent is our invitation to enter into a season of penitence and preparation.
- Lent is also a time of self-examination and self-awareness that prepares us to hear Christ's call to repentance. We've talked in recent weeks about repentance, the act of turning our lives toward Christ to follow him. We can't very well repent if we don't know what we need to repent of. Hence, the invitation to self-examination. Lent is time for re-centering our lives and our souls in Christ. It is time for biblical humility whereby we become more certain that we are creatures of the Almighty God, created from dust. Biblical humility involves knowing that we are made in the image of God as creature, created and creating, yet not Creator.
- The world thinks we are weird, especially during Lent. It is weird in our culture to be humble. It is weird in our culture to become more self-aware in order to repent. It is weird to mark ourselves with ashes to remind us of our mortality in an age when being forever young is the goal. Jesus calls us to be weird, especially during Lent.
- Over the next 40 days of Lent, may we all be a little weird. May we stop and examine ourselves and our souls, admitting that we are not perfect. May we take time to study Scripture and pray more. May we follow Jesus more intentionally and more wholeheartedly. Instead of wondering what the world thinks of us, maybe we will wonder what Jesus thinks of us, instead.

Mental Health Initiative

Our youth group would like to invite the family of St. Helena's to help us collect needed items to fill, "Mental Health Bags."

- We, the youth of St. Helena's, are constantly around people, at school, work, and even at home. We never know what someone is going through - either family problems, friend problems or even just not being in the right place at the moment.
- St. Helena's high school youth group decided to help others who are facing mental/emotion challenges by leading the church in **creating and distributing mental health bags for people who are struggling** and could use a distraction, a moment to center themselves and breathe, or just that extra ray of sunshine in their lives.
- We all acknowledge that there is a mental health crisis in our world, but how do we begin to contribute to a solution to this problem?
- Our youth group would like to invite the family of St. Helena's to help generate needed items to fill, "Mental Health Bags." We are working in conjunction with Hunter Beaton and Day One Bags of Texas, who will be providing the cloth bags that will hold the donated items.
- Once we have collected the items and filled the bags, each high school youth member will take bags to different entities in town who encounter people in crisis. These entities will include fire stations & EMS stations, Hill Country Family Services, the local law enforcement entities, school nurses, etc...
- The final week of February will be our collection week. Our youth leadership team will create a Post-it note board that will be available at church for people to choose items to donate so that we get equal amounts of each item. Items will be things like clicky pens, gum, stress balls, inspirational cards, etc. Our youth group will also write individual notes of support to place in each bag. Once we have the items, the youth will pack the bags in early March and distribute them.

Thank you in advance for your support of this important youth outreach program.

St. Helena's Outreach Accomplishments in 2023

The Outreach Steering Committee would like to provide an update on accomplishments in 2023, and plans for 2024! Click the <u>blue links</u> to learn more about these organizations.

Locally we supported the following needs:

- Held 3 very successful '<u>Blessings in a Backpack</u>' collections of peanut butter and canned chicken, providing less fortunate children in Boerne schools food for the weekends. On Jan 11, 2024, 605 bags were packed, a record!
- Increased our monthly outreach funding to <u>Hill Country Family Services</u> (HCFS) and to Blessings in a Backpack.
- Provided funding for two book fairs at Curington Elementary for children who otherwise may not have been able to obtain books.
- Provided <u>Transformation House</u> with supplies, a \$5000 sponsorship for their annual run/walk, and a \$1000 donation. Provide Christmas meals for 4 families.
- Conducted a cereal drive collection in May.
- Conducted a back to school clothing drive in partnership with Hill Country Daily Bread.
- Held a pet food collection during Blessing of the Animals, supporting Boerne Animal Services.
- Provided Maty's Box with support and extra food supplies.
- Held a personal hygiene drive in November, in collaboration with HCFS.
- Held the annual Angel Tree project, providing Christmas gifts to children in our schools. In 2023, we doubled our efforts by giving gifts so children at two schools, adding Champion HS and continuing with Boerne Middle School North.



Regionally, we supported the following efforts:

- Provided \$1000 for supplies for the Diocesan Respite Center.
- Began an initiative with Blessings Bags, providing food, water and personal items packed by our youth, who added a written prayer. These were distributed to less fortunate persons in need whom we encounter on the streets.
- Restarted the Blood Mobile coming to St. Helena's twice in 2023.
- Provided a \$500 donation to <u>Christian Job Corps of Kendall-Bander</u> counties.

Globally we supported:

- Initiated a fundraiser for <u>Episcopal Relief and Development</u> to provide relief for victims of earthquakes in Turkey and Syria and for tornado victims in Mississippi.
- Sponsored/provided \$1500 to 'Fishin for Mission', funds to support Diocesan World Mission
- Donated \$400 to Diocesan World Mission fundraiser dinner in October.
- Supported Wounded Knee mission trip.

Cursillo Retreat March 17 - 20 at Camp Capers. Cursillo (a Spanish word meaning "little course") gives church members the tools and "rules of life" to enthusiastically share the joys of knowing Christ with others in their everyday environments. Cursillo is patterned on Jesus' own example. He searched out and called groups of potential leaders, trained them and sent them out to bring the world to Him.
